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## Site Specific Requirements for Imported Materials

Dear Valued Customer,

Work sites are being increasingly subject to environmental compliance regulations such as Remediation Action Plans (RAP), and restrictions on the importation and use of recycled products. This is typically due to pre-existing site contamination or a negative experience on a previous project.

Benedict would like to respectfully advise our customers that it's your responsibility to fully inform us at the time of quoting of any project-specific conditions, including but not limited to, a site controlled by an EPA Site Auditor, an applicable Remediation Action Plan, or any other site-specific requirement that may impact on the importation of materials to your project.

Most RAPs place restrictions and requirements on the importation of materials. It is common practice for a RAP to request that all imported materials are to be tested for the site-specific criteria **before** being imported to site. Since this type of testing can be project-specific and is not necessarily part of our quality control testing, it is the customer's responsibility to ensure that **any contamination testing**, **if required**, **is to be carried out at the quarry where the proposed material is produced and stockpiled, ready for dispatch to your site.** 

Benedict has been offering the service of product testing and stockpile pre-approval at the quarry source for many years and are keen to help you to meet your specific site compliance requirements.

To arrange your testing and/or stockpile inspection, please complete the Benedict Site Access Request for Product Testing link on our website in the products tab at least 3 days in advance. After the testing has been completed and the material has been approved by the customer, a purchase order is required before any material can then be ex-binned or delivered from our quarries to your site.

Please Note: Benedict does not accept any liability regarding contamination of our materials after they have been tested and approved at our quarry sites. The costs, therefore, associated with the rejection of any Benedict products delivered to customer sites, due to a failure to <a href="mailto:meet project-specific environmental compliance">meet project-specific environmental compliance</a> standards, shall be borne by the customer. Simply put, we can control our site conditions, but we cannot control the condition of the sites that our materials are placed in.
